costs by the plaintiff in this behalf expended.

against him at the last term of this Court for failing to attend as a juror in the
trial of civil cases is discharged.

Ordered that Warren Edwards & Melville Gayfers of the inhabitants of roads of this
County be set to the lowest undeteriorate the rebuilding of the bridge across Mapenburg's
Mill Tail next to Gilbert Edwards' and the repairs of the other bridge across
the said Mapenburg's Mill Tail and make report to Court.

Ordered that the Clerk register Augustus Smith alias a free negro, who was
born free in this County as appears by the testimony of James Handley

Ordered that George C. Dope be appointed Surveyor of the road from Ames
Jesus Gate to Whitehead's Meeting house in room of Eliza Goff &c and
it is ordered that the usual hours do work thereon.
