Memorandum: On the trial of this motion the Defendant by his Attorney excepted to an opinion of the Court given against him, and tendered his bill of exceptions, which was received signed and sealed by the Court and added to be made a part of the record in this cause.

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County out any contingent money in his hands and not otherwise appropriated pay to James W. Parker fifteen dollars for making out polls.
