

An Unpublished copy of the last will and testament of Henry W. Very Jr. was this day produced in Court and ordered to be received. The Green Stancell the executor thereto named having refused to take upon himself the burden of the execution of the said will, on the motion of William J. Harrell of Mobile, Tenn. who made oath and induced me, and acknowledged before me in the penalty of twenty five dollars (but without swearing the Court not requiring any affirmation) that he had been appointed by the testator to execute his will and to do all such acts as were necessary to be done in that behalf, I directed him to do so, and he did so, and I directed him to obtain Letters of Administration with the will annexed in due form.

Ordered that Thomas Reddell, Joseph A. Grinnell, John A. Person and D. S. Farmer to any three of them, being seated for the purpose, do appraise all the goods or chattels of Henry W. Tracy deceased, that may be produced before them and make an estimation of the same.

The order made at the last Court of this County directing the Sheriff to summon all the acting Justices of the County to the Court of this County to take into consideration and carry into effect the provisions of the act of Assembly, intituled "An act to authorize the County Clerks and any incorporated City or Town to levy the Sheriff of other respective Counties, Cities and Towns and to provide means therefor," passed January 19<sup>th</sup> 1861, being returned executed and a Majority of the Justices being present and voting on the question, doth accept the said act and for the purpose of raising money to arm the militia and volunteers of this County, doth appoint Thomas Riedy, Thomas J. Dutton, Charles F. Murphy, Benjamin E. Cope and James Holroyd agents to negotiate a loan for and with name of the County of the sum of Forty thousand Dollars payable on eight equal annual payments the first payment to become due the first day of January 1862, carrying interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, and for that purpose the said agents and Justices to issue the bonds of this County, signed, by the said agents and countersigned by the Presiding Justice of this Court in sums of not less than five hundred dollars each, the same to be paid quarterly.

The last will and testament of John Sykes Deed was this day proved  
by the oath of Nathan M. Thomas a subscribing witness thereto, and  
the codicil thereto was proved by the oath of Geo N. Mansfield  
a subscribing witness thereto, and the said will having been  
proved at the last term of this Court by the oath of Joseph  
St. Pierre also a subscribing and the said codicil having been  
proved at the last term of this Court by the oath of Wm S.  
James also a subscribing witness thereto, the said last will  
and codicil were found to be sound as the true last  
will and testament and codicil of the said John Sykes Deed
