

At a monthly Term of the County Court of Lincoln, now County, held at the Courthouse, thereof on Monday the 15<sup>th</sup> Day of July 1861.

Present, Samuel R. Hello, Justic<sup>e</sup> Justice, Robt. M. Doles,  
James E. Davis, & Elliott D. Stoy, Justic<sup>e</sup>s.

The Clerk this day returned a list of all writings admitted to record in this Court during and since the last preceding Term under Chapter 121 of the Code of Virginia, which list having been read to the Court is ordered set out in the minutes of the proceedings of the day and is as follows, to wit:

Died by Bargain and Sale dated 20<sup>th</sup> March 1861, from Archibald S. Oldham  
wife of Archd. W. Call & Mat. A. Bell Executrix of James T.  
Burke dec'd. In May Mr. Hollings Conveying Land, was admitted  
to record June 17<sup>th</sup> 1861.

Written dated 17<sup>th</sup> day of June 1861, from McColl W. Briggs to Lewis  
Almonde here, being admitted to record June 17<sup>th</sup> 1861.

Ordered that George W. Vining Sheriff of this County take into his hands the  
estate of Edg<sup>r</sup> H. Neff deceased, to be administered according to Law.

Ordered that Wm. E. Gray & Seth A. Rishforth Esq<sup>r</sup> of the Commissioners of  
Roads of this County, with Commissioner from Gloucester County, etc. to the  
Court understandeth the history of the Ferry across Black Water at  
South Laffey to make report to Court the 1<sup>st</sup> day of August 1861.

The said Will and Testament of Lewis Rivers Esq<sup>r</sup> was this day proved by  
the oath of Robt. H. Whifield, a subscribing witness thereto and the  
codicil thereto was proved by the oath of Robt. H. Whifield also  
a subscribing witness to the same, and the said Will and Testament  
having been prob<sup>d</sup> at the May Term 1861, of the Court of the  
Bath of William Rabell & Nathan Turner Jr. also subscribing wit-  
nesses thereto, and the codicil thereto having been proved also at the  
May Term 1861, of this Court by the oath of Nathan Turner junior,  
also a subscribing witness to the same, the said will and testament  
and codicil of the said Lewis Rivers dec'd. And on the motion of  
Ranholomew Rivers andicular Lawyer the executors therein  
named who made oath and entered into and acknowledged before  
the penalty of Two hundred and fifty thousand dollars conditioned  
according to law (but without security) the will directing that none  
should be required of them to publish it is granted them for ob-  
taining a probate of the said will in due form.

Ordered that Jessie Hobson, Ann Larkins, Patrick Lewis, Thomas  
Joyce or any other of them being seven for the purpose to administer  
all the goods or chattels of said Rivers dec'd that may be per-  
mitted to them, & make due return of the same.
