A Writing bearing date July 24th 1861, purporting to be the last

On the motion of Godwin Parker who made oath and took an oath
Edgar James Vaughan his executor (who justified on oath as to
the sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond with sureties
of four thousand dollars conditioned according to law, to perform and
execute his duty in obtaining letters of administration on the estate
of James H. Parker dec'd. in due form.

being sworn for the purpose do approve all the goods
and chattels of James H. Parker dec'd that may be found
that we make due return of the same.
