Pittman & Melvin Williams and acknowledge^d about executed to the Committee of Poor Compt^r of the Confederate States of America by J. J. Doolittle for fifty thousand dollars. The Court is of opinion that the parties and the bond are deeply good for a much larger amount than the specified sum of fifty thousand dollars and orders that this be endorsed on said bond by the Clerk of the Court.

On the motion of George W. Vick Sheriff of this County, Johnathan Davis, Parker D. Gray and Wm. E. Gay are permitted to qualify as his deputies, it being the opinion of the Court that they be men of publick honesty and good reuearor. Whereupon they took the several oaths prescribed by law.

Ordered that J. D. Trotter be appointed Surveyor of the road from the Residenc^e of Dr. G. J. Trotter to the Franklin road with the sum of Fifty-D^o Recount execued. And it is ordered that the usual hands do work thereon.

The Account of Richard J. Damon with the Committee of Poor of this County was examined by the Comit^e and by their appurposed and ordered to be filed, and that he pay to Rev. E. Dole the present Treasurer of the said Committee the sum of \$138.15 the balance appearing in his hands by the said account.

Ordered that the account of John L. Gray Constable amounting to \$11.10 be certified to the auditor of public accounts for payment.
