The Clerk this day returned a list of all writings admitted to record in this Court during the  
last preceding Term under Chapter 121 of the Code of Virginia, which list having been read the  
Court is ordered to insert it on the minutes of the proceedings of this day and is as follows:

Deed of bargain and sale dated 30<sup>th</sup> day of May 1861 from Abram J. Davis & Mary V. his wife  
to Madison J. Davis conveying their right, title and interest in a certain tract of land containing  
20 acres by recent survey, was admitted to record the 16<sup>th</sup> of September 1861.

Deed of bargain and sale dated 10<sup>th</sup> day of March 1859 from James Bradshaw & Amilia his wife  
to William Lambord conveying a tract of land containing by estimation 25 acres more or less  
was admitted to record 28<sup>th</sup> September 1861.

Ordered that P. W. McFielet be added to the appraisers hereof or appointed to appraise the estate  
of Harrison J. Jones <sup>as per his will</sup> and that any one of the said appraisers to act "make up" <sup>as per his will</sup>

Ordered that the account of Robert M. Davis a Justice of the Peace for this County, appearing  
on a panel dated the 18<sup>th</sup> day of September 1861 be continued in force for the term of three months for  
him to receive no compensation for his services.

Ordered that the account of John L. Sampson Esquire amounting to \$2.20 be certified to  
the Auditor of Public accounts for his examination if required.

The last Will and Testament of George T. James <sup>deceased</sup> was proved by the oaths of J. E. Tamm  
and John T. Board the Subscribing Notaries thereunto and ordered to be recorded. And in the  
action of Mark A. James v. William A. Jones the Executrix thereon named who made oath  
and together with Thomas M. Atkinson Esq. - Attorney (who justified on oath as his sufficiency)  
entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned as the  
law directs certificate is granted him for drawing a probate of this said Will in due form.

Ordered that Benjamin F. Waller, Edwin Hanes & John Whitchard be of first duly  
sworn for the purpose to appraise all the goods or chattels of George T. James which may be  
produced or shown to them and return the appraisement signed by themselves to the Clerk of this Court

The last Will and Testament of William G. Compton <sup>deceased</sup> was proved by the oaths of W. W. Dugay  
& Thos A. Bragg the Subscribing Notaries thereunto and ordered to be recorded. And in the action of  
Benjamin F. Story the Executor thereon named who made oath and together with Eliot S. Story and  
William W. Dugay his Sureties (who justified on oath as their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged  
a bond in the penalty of two thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted  
him for drawing a probate of the said Will in due form.

Ordered that James Holmes, James Brummett & Matthew Williams, each being first duly sworn fortho  
to appraise all the goods or chattels of William G. Compton which may be produced or shown to them  
return the appraisement signed by themselves to the Clerk of this Court.
