Ann Weaver a negro who stands charged with robbing by her committed in the County of Southampton and within the jurisdiction of this Court in this that she the said Ann Weaver did unlawfully and indecently break the kitchen, an out house or the premises of and the property of Charles Hollands, and the contents of the sum of the value of four hundred dollars was the day before the lynch meeting held in the jail of the County and being thereof accused pleaded not guilty and further that she said Ann Weaver is guilty of the offence whereof she stands charged and it being demanded of her of any thing for herself she had a right to say why she said she did not make further to prosecute for assault against her and nothing being offered or alleged in defense judgment is reserved by the Court that the said Ann Weaver be confined in the penitentiary of the Commonwealth for term of three years, therein to be kept and treated as the law directs. And it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County shall as soon as may be convenient after the adjournment of this Court, remove and safely convey the said Ann Weaver from the jail of this County to the said Penitentiary and there abiding be the Superintendent thereof. And the seal of this Court is commanded to goe.

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County summon all the acting Justices thereof to January Court and to consider such subject as may be brought before them connected with the existing War.
