

On the motion of James May Jr. guardian of David H. Kinder, Elizabeth Kinder and Sally Kinder he is allowed to expend the sum of \$300.00 of the principal of David H. Kinder's estate and \$100.00 each of the principal of Elizabeth and Sally Kinder's estates for their schooling.

On the motion of Samuel D. Williams & John Dettlar who made oath and depose that James & Joseph C. Delann (their son-in-laws) (who just died in debt as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of twenty thousand Dollars conditioned according to law. Correspondence is granted them for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Joseph Dettlar dec'd. in due form.

The Court doth nominate & appoint Richard L. Bryant guardian of Joseph D. Sharp, & Ann Lucia Sharp, Mary F. Sharp (and Thomas Sharp or perhaps of Ann Sharp dec'd) and thereupon in, together with Henry J. Bryant and William D. Bryant his executors (who just died in debt as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Three thousand Dollars conditioned according to law.

The Court doth appoint L. R. Edwards to state, settle and audit and make report to the Court the accounts of Henry D. Cole, the Treasurer of the Committee or agents of the Court appointed at June term last and, the act of a assembly, relative to and to authorize the County Courts and any incorporated City or Town to arm the Militia of their respective Counties, Cities or Towns and to provide means therefor passed January 19th 1861st.

Ordered that the Clerk register Jesse Blanton, free negro, who was long free in this County as appears by the testimony of Daniel R. Keller your former register.

William H. Summerville is appointed Surveyor of the road from Broad Water Person to Little Rock and bridge in the town of Thomas Blanton, deceased and it is ordered that the usual hands be sent thereon.

Wm. D. Briggs late Sheriff of this County, this day accounted to the Court several lists of Capt. Blanton's taxes as paid on which mules and free negroes in this County which should be collected. He found one amounting \$72.00 and the other \$236.00 having been paid by the clerk of the Sheriff and duly verified by the Commissioners of the Revenue and having been examined by the Court, and the Court being satisfied of the correctness of the same, and also satisfied that copies of said lists were sent out at the Court door of the Courtroom of this County, on a Court day.
