

At a Monthly Term of the County Court of Southampton County held at the Court House thereof on Monday the 19th day of May 1862. Samuel B. Keller Presiding Justice James M. Lewis

The Clerk this day returned a list of all writings admitted to Record in this Court during or since the last preceding Term under the 121st of the Code of Virginia, which last having been inspected by this Court is returned to be inserted among the minutes of the proceedings of the day and is as follows to wit:
Deed of bargain & sale from Eliza Ann L. DeLoe to William M. DeLoe, conveying lands, was admitted to record May 20, 1862.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the acting Justices of this County to the next Term next to lay and adjust the County levy - & for that purpose -

Edwards' trustee with John Randolph DeLoe's having been duly taken on oath & upwards in the Clerk's Office and their long and receipts there were examined, compared and ordered to be recorded.

This case came on this day to be heard on the papers formerly filed, and on the report of the Commissioner made at the last term & which report an exception had been filed and was argued by counsel. On consideration thereof the Court will confirm the said report.

The Commissioner appointed to let to the lowest bidder the repairs of road near the bridge at Franklin this day made report.

The last Will and Testament of Samuel Drury dec^d was produced to the Court. A Writing bearing date the 2^d day of December 1861 purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Samuel Drury dec^d and a certain other, was produced in Court and the subscribing witnesses thereof being absent in absence of the Beneficiaries thereof James Drury and W. H. Drury being sworn solemnly depose and said they are well acquainted with the true writing of the said Samuel Drury and verily believe the said Will executed as well as the signatures thereof to be in the proper hand writing of the said Samuel Drury. Whereupon it is ordered that the said writing be recorded as and for the last Will and Testament of the said Samuel Drury dec^d. And on the motion of William J. Goodenough one of the Executors thereof names also made with and together with Benjamin W. Goodenough, Francis J. Riddle, Thomas Riddle his daughter (who testified in oath as to their diffidence) entered into and acknowledged in the presence of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars conditioned according to law, certificate is given in favor of parties of the said William J. Goodenough for Liberty being secured to themselves or assigns their names to be given as the last probate when they may think fit.

Ordered that James Drury, W. H. Drury, James E. Pickett & Robert Rowland or any three of them being duly sworn for the purpose do appear on all the good & chattels of Samuel Drury dec^d together with the note and what may be subject to the authority of the Executors and return the aforementioned papers by them to the Clerk of this Court.
