

At a Monthly Term of the County Court of Southampton County held at the Court house thereof  
Monday July the 21<sup>st</sup> 1862  
Present. Samuel B. Wells Presiding Justice, Henry B. Jones,  
James Holmes Justice

The clerk this day returned a list of all writings admitted to record during or since the last preceding term of the Court under Chapter 124 of the Code of Virginia, which list having been inspected by the Court, is ordered to be inserted among the minutes of the proceedings of the day and is as follows, to wit:

Deed of bargain and sale from John M. Gentry to James Wells dated 16<sup>th</sup> May 1862, conveying land, was admitted to record the 16<sup>th</sup> day of June 1862.

Deed of bargain and sale from W. H. Cobb to W. A. Bell Executors of James T. Batts of the County of Southampton dated 16<sup>th</sup> day of June 1862, conveying land, was admitted to record the 16<sup>th</sup> day of June 1862.

Ordered that the Overseers of the Poor for any two of them brief James Gentry, executor of a will, to pay the said Gentry the sum of thirty dollars at his coming at the age of sixteen years and to furnish him with a new suit of clothes.

The last Will and Testament of John Little died was proved according to law by the oath of W. H. Bury one of the subscribing witnesses thereto and confirmed for further proof.

On the motion of Peter L. Holmes deceased's will according to law and together with James Holmes & Nathaniel Barnes his executors (who justified on oath without difference) returned and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of twenty five thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, and which is given to him for having letters of administration on the estate of Georgeina Baily deceased in due form.

Ordered that Amos Summrell, Robert Proctor & Samuel B. Wells being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for the purpose to appraise all the goods or chattels of Georgeina Baily deceased and return the appraisement signed by them to the clerk of this Court.

George M. Vick Sheriff of the County this day returned a list of several bonds being money lent to \$216.25 which was examined and allowed by the Court.

George M. Vick Sheriff of this County this day returned his account with the County, showing balances due the County of \$2825.33, which he will return in his hands subject to the future order of the Court.

Joseph Gardner who was on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of May 1862 duly elected by the qualified voters of the County of Southampton, Commissioner of the Revenue for Northampton Parish in said County, he swore as such for the term of two years, commencing on the first day of February 1863 and after the said term of office shall have expired and he desires to qualify to enter upon the discharge of his duties of said office, this day with W. H. Bury Robert Proctor & Thomas A. Bury his executors returned into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, which bond is ordered to be received. The said Joseph Gardner also took the oaths required by law.
