This cause came on this day to be argued in the papers previously read and on the report of the Com-
missioner made at the last Term to which an exception has been filed and was argued by Counsel. On consideration
whereof the Court appearing at which report shall hereby confirm the said

The Account of Nathaniel Brown & Supton Lawrence Executors proceeding on Ben Brown's Estate,
of East George guardian of George W. Hillman, of William C. Gray guardian of Susan T. Jackson,
of John W. Graham's guardian of Mary & David, Walter S. Darden, Anne & W. Darden, Emeline
Darden & John W. Darden having lawfully law on receipt and upwards in the Clerk's Office and there being
no exception thereto and examined, confirmed and ordered to be recorded

Ordered that Ben C. Pope, Wm. De Shields, Wm. V. Venable, John Porter & C. M. McLaughlin be hereby
appointed a Committee to be called the "Sellers and Purchasers" for the County of Southampton, whose duty
it shall be to locate all arithmetical necessary and proper to all soldiers in service residents of the said County
and who may be sick, wounded or otherwise in need of friendly attention. And they said Committee is fully authorized
to purchase horses and waggon and to make any expenditure of money on account of this County, or requis for that
purpose. And the Committee are authorized to draw on the Sheriff of this County for a sum not exceeding two thousand
dollars out of any moneys in his hands not otherwise appropriated
They are further authorized to fill any vacancy which may occur in their own body -

John M. Gandy, who was on the 22nd day of May 1862 duly elected by the qualified voters of the County of South-
ampton Commissioner of the Revenue for the said County to hold as such for the term of two years,
terminating on the first day of February 1863 and after the said term of office shall have expired until he succeeds is
qualified to take upon the discharge of his duties of said office - this day with C. B. Donnell & W. R. Parker his brethren
intervened with and acknowledged a bond in the sum of five thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, which bond
is ordered to be recorded - the said John M. Gandy also took the oaths required by law

Ordered that Ben C. Pope, C. F. Venable, Thomas Ralley, James Holmes & Thomas J. Portlow be appointed
a Committee to make all necessary arrangements for the receipt and distribution of the salt produced at Upper Trout
Branch and St. J. Saltworks &c. The Committee being authorized to charge such a price for the salt as to be in conformity
with the County -

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term
