

At a quarterly Term of the County Court of Southampton County held at the Court house thereof on Monday the 12th day of August 1862.

Little the executors thereof named who made oath and together with John W. Little Daniel W. Cobb and Edward M. Little certain persons who purposed on oath as to their sufficiency in law and acknowledged about in the presence of Wm. Little dec'd. \$1000.00 Dollars conditioned according to law.
