

a bond in the penalty of two hundred Dollars conditioned according to law, Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Chauncy Hurd dec'd in due form.

Ordered that Willis Bradshaw, James G. Jones, and John Jones being sworn for the purpose, do appraise all the goods and chattels of Chauncy Hurd dec'd. that may be produced to them and make due return of the same.

On the motion of James G. Jones who made oath and together with Alfred S. Stephenson & Willis Bradshaw, his co-appraisers (the latter justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered in and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of one thousand Dollars conditioned according to law, Certificate is granted to the said James G. Jones for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Chauncy Hurd dec'd in due form.

Ordered that J. D. Boykin, John S. Boykin and Thomas Dwyer being sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods and chattels of Chauncy Hurd dec'd that may be produced to them and make due return of the same.

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County in paying the costs of prosecuting, imprisoning and selling Washington Brown a free negro, convicted at the last term of this Court of felony and ordered to be sold into slavery, pay to the said William the sum of fifty Dollars awarded paid by him for the arrest or apprehension of the said Washington Brown and William B. Shands, attorney at law, the sum of twenty five Dollars for his services in defending the said Washington Brown in his trial, and that the Clerk of this Court include those sums in paying the costs of the said prosecution.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of March next.
