Hollings Amended Decree as per amended Decree, &c.

On the motion of E. H. Gray, guardian of George A. Hollings he is allowed to expend the sum of \$1500.00 of the principal of his ward's estate and he is authorized to allow his ward to take with him to his farm six of his negroes he having debts.

The last Will and Testament of Osmin A. Gardner was this day proved by the oaths of Mend J. Davis and Madison Davis the subscribing witnesses thereof and ordered to be recorded. And in the motion of Benjamin Gardner the executor therein named who made oath and together with James Hurdley and William Kitchin, his securities (who testified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five thousand Dollars conditioned according to law. Execution is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.

Ordered that Mend J. Davis, Ed. Spivey, Wm. G. Stephens and Richard Stephenson, or any three of them being sworn for the purpose to appraise all the goods & chattels of Osmin A. Gardner dec'd. that may be produced to them and make due return of the same.

Ordered that George W. Tuck, Sheriff of this County take into his hands the estate of Benjamin J. Beardslee Esq. administered according to law.
