belonging to the estate of James Harris dec'd in Chancery Court

into the hands of bonds in his name as guardian for the said wards for the
amount due to each ward and as administrator of James Harris
and that he use due diligence in collecting the interest accruing

ceive in Chancery State Bonds or bonds of the State of Virginia

accruing thereon and apply the same as the law directs.
