The Board of the Overseers of the poor of this County this day made their annual report which is ordered to be filed.

Jackson his securities, (who justified in oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of three thousand Dollars conditioned according to law, Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Thomas C. Ordered that Alphonse Jackson, Jas. S. Stephenson, M. M. Clayton and George W. Spring, or any three of them, being sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods or chattels of Thomas C. Johnson decd. that may be provided to them and make due return of the same.

On the motion of Lucian Lawrence who made oath and together with Alphonse Jackson, his securities, (who justified in oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of fifteen hundred Dollars conditioned according to law, Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Washington Jackson Decd. in due form.

Ordered that Wm Dabb, Thomas J. Spring, Alphonse Jackson, being sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods or chattels of Washington
