George H. Fugger appointed Surveyor of the roads from the Blackhead Bridge post to about Popes in the river of Head Pope and it is ordered that the usual road work thereon.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the acting Justices of the County to the next Court to take into consideration the propriety of renewing or rejecting the contract made for the repair or rebuilding Dammond bridge & Middle branch bridge.

George C. Pope & Benj. W. Hinckley who have been Commissioned Justices of the Peace in the second District in the County in the place of John E. Briggs & Nathan At. Thomas Esq<sup>r</sup> appeared in Court and qualified by taking the oath prescribed by law.

Present George C. Pope Justice.

Ordered that the State Bureau Department be requested to retain fifteen dollars per month of the wages due the free negro laborers from this County and now in the said State <sup>as may be required for</sup> to be appointed an agent to collect and after paying their taxes distribute the balance among the families of such freemen.

On the motion of Nancy Atkin free negro the consent of the court is hereby given for her to bring her son Horatio Atkin of the age of twelve years to Stephen Henderson according to law. the said Stephen Henderson to pay annually to the said Nancy Atkin forty dollars, except for the last year which is to be paid to the apprentice.

Ordered that the Sheriff pay the several accounts due for rations furnished the families of soldiers as they may be presented, up to the 21<sup>st</sup> day of September 1860.

On the motion of John D. Whiggins who made oath and together with William Elzey and George W. Vick his subscribers (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the sum of two thousand dollars, conditioned according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Eliza Parker deceased in due form.

On the motion of C. W. Mayenburg who made oath and together with James D. Mayenburg his subscriber (who justified on oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the sum of five hundred dollars conditioned according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of William Holloman deceased in due form.

The last Will and Testament and the Codicil thereto annexed, of Nathaniel At. Sherman was produced in Court and the will was proved by the oath of George M. Turner one of the subscribing witnesses thereto the said George M. Turner also testified that Edmund P. Turner, who is now dead, and himself described his name as witness to the will in the presence and at the request of the testator.
