within the jurisdiction of the Court, in this to wit, that he said Ben Peterson,
of October 1st 1813, in the said County unlawfully and feloniously Stole,
away three colt black and one coltow that the property of John Brewer of 15
dollars was this day set to stand in Custody of the Sheriff of this County, and his
not guilty and the Court having heard the evidence are unanimously of opinion that the said Ben
Peterson is guilty of Stealing goods and chattels of less value than twenty dollars therefore a consti-
tuted by the Court that the said Ben Peterson be confined in jail for twelve hours and during
portion of said time that he receive thirty nine lashes on his bare back will laid on at the polls
whipping post and thin and short leathered from Custody. and that the Sheriff cause reading
of this judgment to be done upon the body of the said Ben Peterson.

Bellin Reed a free man who stands charged with a felony by him committed in this County and
within the jurisdiction of this Court, we find to rest, that the said Bellin Reed did on the first
