Ordered that A. T. Stephenson, Geo W. Spring, W. F. Berry & R. M. Hale or any three of them being first duly sworn for the purpose do appear before the said Clerk of the Court at his office and return the appearance under their hands to the Clerk of the Court.

On motion of A. T. Stephenson guardian of Mary L. Davis he is hereby authorized to invest One thousand dollars of his said Ward money in Comptroller's State stocks receive the interest thereon annually and account for the same according to law.

Ordered that Thomas J. Paxton be and he is hereby authorized to execute the bonds of County for old timber marks after due for the contracts made for the timber of instant covered by him while acting as agent for the County or according to the time of contract.
