Ordered that John W. Harrison, Wm. H. Whithead & William H. Briddle being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for the purpose do appear all the goods or chattels of Samuel Briddle to be and return the appearance under their hands to the Clerk of this Court—

Ordered that L. R. Edwards, W. B. Simms & R. H. Blythe being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for the purpose do appear all the goods or chattels of James T. Parker deceased and return the appearance under their hands to the Clerk of this Court—

On motion of Wm. T. Bryant and for reasons appearing to the Court, he is except from the payment of fees & taxes in future, he being aged & infirm—

Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the acting Justices of this County to the first day of the next term of this Court to consider the expediency of laying upon land and other property appertaining thereto within this County, and an interest in property mentioned in the 1st, the yearly income in the \$1st and the sum in the 5th Sections of the 65th Chapter of the Code of Virginia of 1860 in which taxes are to be paid against persons residing in the County—

The last will and testament of Nancy Chitty deceased by the oath of John Robertson one of the subscribing witnesses thereto—

Ordered that the estate of Nancy Chitty deceased be committed to the hands of the Sheriff of this County to be administered according to law—

Ordered that Ben. B. H. Miller, Edward Bostick & Miles Britt being first duly sworn for the purpose do appear all the goods or chattels of Nancy Chitty deceased and return the appearance under their hands to the Clerk of this Court—

Ordered that the black negress Hack Brown, free negro, who was born in the County of Albemarle from her former master—

Absent all the Justices except G. B. Kello, formerly Justice, William Verghehart & James Holmes, Justices—

On the motion of Robert Poston administrator of Absentee B. Poston deceased Ordered that he receive the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars in his hands belonging to R. G. Poston
