Ordered that the Clerk give notice at least one place in each town in this County notifying all persons holding bonds against this County dated 1st of April, bond to the Clerk of this Court on or before the 15th day of May, so the intent will cause record on all bonds not so reported.

Ordered that Charles register Bellomy Henry Ricks for negro he was born free in this County as appears from the testimony of Dr Edwards.

✓ On motion of Exmo'r Bryant he is excused from Surveying as Overseer of the Poor in the
2^d Magisterial District in this County.

The acting Justices of this County, having by an order made at the last term of the Court, but deferred to meet on this day, to consider the property of living, unpaid and other property of slaves within this County, and upon information, the yearly income and the fees of office as authorized by the 5th Section of Chapter 35 of the Code of Virginia of 1800. The Court after due consideration of the subject, did order (a majority of the acting Justices of the County being present) and concurred therein, after where a levy is made for the purpose of raising money for or in the County, shall be on all free male persons in the County over the age of twelve years, until death herebefore and who may hereafter be unaffected from taxes, glebe, an all slave land and other property of slaves within this County, and in the districts, & parishes mentioned in the 49th, the yearly income in the 51st and the fee in the 59th Section of Chapter 35 of the Code of Virginia of 1800, on which taxes are apportioned against persons residing in this County. The levy to be for a certain sum on each free male person not the age of 18 years and on other subjects, including slaves, for a certain sum levied for the payment of taxes thereon, and the rest in proportion to persons having less than 18 years of age, for the year. It is ordered that the apportion for the year 1863 be adopted at the end of next the levy.
