The acting Justices of this County, having by an order made at the last term of this Court, (and summoned) to meet on this day, to consider the propriety of levying upon land and other property subjects with a State tax within this County, and upon interest profits, the yearly income and the fees of officers as authorized by the 5th Section of Chapter 35 of the Code of Virginia of 1860. - The Court after due consideration of the subjects did order (a majority of the acting Justices of the County being present and consenting) that hereafter when a levy is made for the purpose of raising money for or for the benefit of any public use, or on all free male persons in the County over the age of twenty years, and those hereafter and who may hereafter be exempted from tax as slaves, and all slaves (land and other property subjects with a State tax, within this County, and at the rate of 5 profits million is on the 29th, the yearly income in the 31st, and the fees in the 5th Section of Chapter 35 of the Code of Virginia 1860, on which taxes are applied against persons residing in this County. The levy to be for a certain sum on each free male person and on the 10 years and on other subjects, including slaves, for a certain sum certain for the amount of taxes thereon. And the next imposing taxes having been submitted for the present year, it is ordered that the apportionment for the year 1863 be adopted at the next term of the levy.
