

At a Monthly Term of the County Court of Southampton County held at the Courthouse
thereon on Monday the 1st day of July 1861.

The Clerk returned a list of all writings admitted to record in this Court or by said Clerk in his office, during or since the last preceding term of this Court, under Chapter 121 of the Code of Virginia, which list being read to the Court, is ordered to be inserted in the minutes in the words and figures following, to wit:

Deed of bargain & sale, dated 22nd March 1861, from Alpheus W. Collier, Esq.,
and wife, conveying real estate, was admitted to record June 20th 1861,

The account of Thomas Riddings' Examinations proceedings on Robert Riddings' estate,
Vicks administration or Julius C. Harris' estate, of G.W. Vicks' administration or
estate, of Thos. D. Worrell & Davis' Bank's administration or James Hollis' estate, of
Bank's administration or Thomas & Johnson's, of Jonathan Shipp's administration or
Margaret Dainger's, etc., of Mary Ann Willison's administration or Alpheus C. Willison's,
generally known as month and upwards in the Clerk's Office, and there being no exception thereto,
were examined, confirmed and ordered to be recorded -

The account of John Postlow's administration on Belinda Postlow's estate, also
debtors and demands against said estate and the account of the balance in the hands of the
administrator among the several creditors having been one month and upwards in the Clerk's Office
and there being no exception filed thereto, were examined, confirmed and ordered to be recorded, and the
Court doth adjudge, order and direct that John Postlow pay to the sum of \$11,500.00
and to Robert Bayford, of 17. 28 with interest on the said amounts from March 1st 1861 forward.

The account of James Jones & A. T. Stephenson's guardianship of Sibyl Johnson, of Thos. D. Worrell
& Davis' Bank's guardianship of Osmore Holt & Effie Holt, of Fortunatus Dunn's guar-
denship of James Prine, of John B. Jenkins' guardianship of Mary J. Dardis & Willis B.
Dardis, of Robert S. Barns' guardianship of Pauline J. Worrell, of Willis Bradburn's guar-
denship of John James & Elizabeth Worrell and of Elliott Gray's guardianship of George
A. Holloman having been one month and upwards in the Clerk's Office and there being no
exception thereto, were generally examined, confirmed and ordered to be recorded -

The last Will and Testament of John R. Woodard deceased was this proved by the wife of C. B.
Barham & H. Mills & Ruth the Subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded
and in the nation of Jefferson J. Woodard the Executor therein named who made oath and
affirmed unto the Clerk a bond, the Will directing that no security should be required,
in the penalty of One thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted
him for drawing a portion of the said estate in due form.

A Writing bearing date the 5th day of September 1861 purporting to be the last Will and
Testament of James H. Drury deceased was produced in Court in order to be read and the
Subscribing witnesses thereto being in the Confederate service as soldiers, John H. Peters and
David H. Drury being sworn and examined, and from their evidence to the hearing of the
Court that the said writing and the signature of said H. Drury thereto is what is in the hand
