The last will and testament of Elizabeth Barwell dec'd was proved by the oath of John W ... one of the subscribing witnesses thereto -

William W. Boyce who was on the 26th day of May 1865 duly elected Sheriff of Southampton County by the qualified voters thereof to serve as such for the term of two years commencing on the first day of January 1865, and after the said term shall have expired until his successor is qualified to enter upon the discharge of the duties of said office, this day appeared in Court and together with W. C. Bell, John Cobb, Rufus B. Shivers, Dr. J. A. ... together with ... Geo. W. Vick, Wm. B. Shivers & James D. Bryant his sureties who justified on oath as to their sufficiency, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the sum of one hundred and twenty five thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs which bond is ordered to be recorded. And thereupon the said William W. Boyce took the several oaths prescribed by law -

On the motion of James B. Vezegant who made oath and together with Wm. Vezegant & Charles F. Vezegant his sureties (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the sum of two hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs which bond is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Henry B. Vezegant dec'd in due form -

Ordered that Peter J. Holmes, John Preston, Wm. H. Lammert & Samuel H. Holmes or any three of them being first duly sworn for the purpose, do appraise all the goods or chattels of Henry B. Vezegant dec'd and return the appraisement under their hands to the Clerk of this Court -

John Corson who was on the 26th day of May 1865 duly elected Constable in the third District in this County to serve as such for the term of two years commencing on the first day of July 1864, this day with Benjamin B. Shivers, James Barnes, Richard L. Bryant & Charles C. Bryant his sureties who justified on oath as to their sufficiency, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the sum of five thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs which bond is ordered to be recorded - and the said John Corson took the several oaths prescribed by law -

William R. Worrell who has been elected Overseer of the Poor in the 2^d District in this County this day appeared in Court and qualified according to law -

Ordered that the Clerk register Dickerson's Bond for negro, who was born free in this County as appears from the testimony of James H. Parker.

The Court certifies ^{from the testimony of James H. Parker a white man} that it appears to their satisfaction that ^{as Charles Bryant - free man} ^{Indiana Brooker - resident of} this County was not a free negro but a person of mixed blood, a descendant of a female of the African tribe of Indians. This certificate is granted under the 17th Section of Chapter 107 of the Code of Virginia of 1860.

Ordered that Samuel Mills Sheriff of this County take into his hands the estate of Martha Boyce ... and administer the same according to law -
