John Byrnes, conveying negro boy Geo. was admitted to record October 24th 1864

The account of James J. Durden's guardianship of Mary A. Story & of Wm. J. Story's guardianship
of Willie R. D. Story showing land tax moneys and reports in the Clerk's Office and their being no receipt
thereof were severally examined, confirmed and ordered to be recorded.

This cause this day came on to be argued in the papers formerly read and on the report of the
Clerk of the Court made at the last Term to which no exception had been filed and was argued by Counsel. On
consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that the said report be confirmed.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the acting Justices of this County to appear here on Friday next to
consider the application of Solomon Dethers slaves emancipated by the last Will & Testament of James
Dethers de for permission to remain in the State & reside in this County.

On the motion of Samuel Hells who made oath and together with Judge B. Vick his Deputy, who justified
on oath as his sufficiency, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two thousand dollars
conditions on the law doth certify a grant is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of
Thomas H. Crumpler de in due form.

Ordered that Judge B. Vick, Robert Ricks & William Richards being first duly sworn for the purpose do
appear all the goods or chattels of Thomas H. Crumpler de that may be produced or shown to them and
return the appraisement under their hands to the Clerk of this Court.

Ordered that one of the Overseers of the poor of this County do bind Octavious, Washington Humphrey, John
Shaw, Rhody, Richard infant children of Catherine Johnson de & Robert B. Proctor according to law
be bound until they arrive to the age of eighteen and the boys until they arrive to the age of twenty one
years and that the Overseers of the poor covenant with the said R. B. Proctor that he shall pay for the services of
said apprentices as follows for Octavious \$20. a year for 3 years for Washington \$25. a year for 4 years
for Rhody \$20. a year for 9 years for John \$25. a year for 8 years for Rhody \$25 a year for 10
years for Richard \$25 a year for 16 years the last years payment to be made to be made at the apprentices as
