The cause this day came on to be heard on the papers formerly read and on the report of the  
Comptroller made at the last term to which no exception had been filed and was argued by Counsel, on  
consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that the said report be confirmed.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the Acting Justices of this County to appear here on Friday next to  
conclude the application of Thomas B. Morris unincorporated by the last Will & Testament of James  
Dobbs die for Pennsylvania to remain in the State & reside in this County.

On the motion of Samuel Hello who made oath and together with Jno B Vick his Deputy, who judg'd  
no cause for difference, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two thousand dollars  
conditioned that law & due certificate is granted him for obtaining letter of administration on the estate of  
Thomas B. Grumpler die in law form.

Ordered that Jno B Vick, Robert Rice & Cullen Kitchens being first duly sworn for the purpose to  
affirm all the goods or chattels of Thomas B. Grumpler die that may be produced or shown to them and  
return the same under their hands to the Clerk of this Court.

Ordered that one of the Overseers of the Poor of this County do bind Octavia, Washington Hinsley, Eliza  
Ann, Rhoda & Richard infant children of Martha Johnson die to Robert B. Postle according to law  
to girls to be bound until they arrive to the age of eighteen and the boys until they arrive to the age of twenty-one  
years and that the Overseer of the Poor covenant with the said R. B. Postle that he shall pay for the services of  
two apprentices as follows for Octavia \$20. a year for 3 years for Washington \$25. a year for 4 years  
for Hinsley \$20. a year for 9 years for Eliza Ann \$15. a year for 8 years for Rhoda \$5. a year for 10  
years for Robert \$5. a year for 16 years the last years payment to be made to the apprentices as
