County. Commission is granted them to remain in the State & reside in the County. It appearing to the Court that
the acting Justice of the County were summoned) and a majority of them present and voting on the
question of permitting said negro to remain in the State; that notice of the application for such permission
was posted at the Notchouse door for at least two months immediately preceding, that the attorney for the
university represented the State as Counsel in the case, and that the applicants produced satisfactory
evidence of their being of good character, sober, peaceful and industrious.

It is further ordered and adjudged by the Court that all the negroes emancipated by the last
Will and Testament of the late J. J. Batts die between the ages of 16 and 14 years, be bound out by
the County Court and that the administration of the said Testator be carried out all
between the ages of 14 and 21 in the males & 14 & 18 in the females and that the proceeds of all
be applied towards the support of the expensive negroes emancipated by said Testator.

Ordered that Sarge B. Vick the agent of this County to purchase for the use of the citizens of this
County cotton, cotton-gins t^r be authorized to purchase cotton cloth so much as to him may seem
proper in view of the wants.

Ordered that the Commissioner of Elections hold an election in said District to supply
the vacancy occasioned by the death of Mathias W. Vaughan late a Justice in said District on the
2^d Sunday in December next.
