

Monthly Court of the County Court of Southampton County held at the Courthouse
on Monday the 19th day of December 1864.

The Commissioners appointed to act to the Court undertake to report a survey of the bridge of
James Creek near bridge over Edmon Harris who say made their report which the Court approved.

In Writing bearing date 19th day of October 1863 purporting to be the last Will and Testament of
J. D. Mafayenburg dec'd was presented to the Court in order to be proved and then being (the Subscribers)
two of the said James D. Parker & P. Edwards were sworn to examine witnesses and from their testimony
the Court is satisfied that the body of the said writing as well as the signature of James D. Mafayenburg thereon
is wholly in the hand writing of the said James D. Mafayenburg dec'd therefore is ordered that the said
writing be recorded as of the last Will and Testament of the said James D. Mafayenburg dec'd. And on the
action of William et al Mafayenburg & Edward W. Mafayenburg the Executrix thereon named who made out
and acknowledged a bond or deposit of Eight thousand dollars (but without interest) by the Will requiring
one to be required a certificate is granted them for drawing a protest of the said Will in the form

Ordered that John Moore, E. H. Munroe, W. G. Rawle & J. B. Presidio or any three of them being
duly sworn for the purpose appear all the goods or chattels of James D. Mafayenburg dec'd and return the
appurtenant under their hands to the Clerk of this Court.

The last Will and Testament of Thomas Shelly dec'd was this day proved by the oaths of James P. Joyner & J. E. P.
Swain the Subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the action of George P. Weston the Counter
theron named who made out and together with Henry W. Peale & Harrison J. Pope his executors (who justified
as well as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond on the penalty of Six thousand Dollars
conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted him for drawing a protest of the said Will in the form

Ordered that Mr. A. James, Justice P. T. Scott & Ray Esq. being sworn for the purpose do appraise all the
goods and chattels of Thomas Shelly dec'd and return the appurtenant under their hands to the Clerk of this Court.

The last Will and Testament of John P. Smith dec'd was proved by the oaths of Wm. A. Mafayenburg & Edwin
Swain the Subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

On motion of Neal C. Vaughan who made out and together with William Ely & Warren Edwards his execu-
tors (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond on the penalty of Three
thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted him for drawing letters of Administration on the
estate of Richard L. Vaughan dec'd in the form

Ordered that Mr. E. Gay, Goodman G. Johnson, W. G. Swain being first duly sworn for the purpose
to appraise all the goods and chattels of Richard L. Vaughan dec'd and return the appurtenant under their hands to the
Court of this Court.
