The last Will and testament of William H. Sumnerwell last was fully proved by the oath of James A. Holmes one of the subscribing witnesses thereto, and there being no subscribing witnesses to the bequest to said Will, said W. H. Sumnerwell being sworn & recommended as witnesses, he had after hearing the testimony of James A. Holmes that the said bequest was a gift of the said W. H. Sumnerwell, and after reading of the last Will and testament of said W. H. Sumnerwell he testified he received as the last Will and testament of said W. H. Sumnerwell and as the bequest of the said W. H. Sumnerwell to said James A. Holmes & Gordon B. Foster the bequest named as the said Will was made with solemnly affirmed with the law doctrs and together with James A. Foster, James H. Perkins John Christian, Maria Bradshaw his daughter who gave testimony as to the bequest, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of fifty thousand dollars conditioned as the law doctrs certificate is granted them for obtaining a Probate of the said last Will and
