

Order in due form
Edw R Gray vs Present J B Kells Justice

A Writing bearing date the 18th December 1857 purporting to be the last Will and Testament of James Harris deceased was produced to the Court with the following witnesses, Blake Lewis & Margaret Johnson the writing was read and attested, and without the knowledge of the witnesses the words "my son Joseph David" substituted thereby the said last clause in the opinion of the Court was cancelled, but that the residue of the said writing was not cancelled, therefore it is considered by the Court that the said writing except the said clause be recorded as and for the last Will and Testament of the said James Harris de^d. And on the motion of Edward R Gray who made oath according to law and together with John Pedler and Adam White his Secretary (who solemnly affirmed as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the sum of fifteen hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs to testify a granted him for having letters of administration with the will annexed on the estate of the said James Harris de^d.

Ordered that Alfred J Stephenson, Robert A Dole, Matthew Harris & Blake Lewis or any three of them being first duly sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods and chattels of James Harris de^d and return the appraisement under their hands to the Clerk of the Court.

The last Will and Testament of John F. Boyle de^d was proved by the oath of Edwin R Gray one of the subscribing witnesses -

A Writing bearing date the 1st day of Sept^r ^{purporting to be the last will and Testament of Albert G. Harris de^d} under 1856 was produced in Court in order to be proved and thereupon the subscribing witnesses W W Briggs & John M. Quayle being sworn and examined as witnesses the Court after hearing the testimony is of opinion that the copy of the said writing as well as the signature thereof is in that hand writing of the said Albert G. Harris therefore it is ordered that the said writing be recorded as and for the last Will and Testament of the said Albert G. Harris de^d and the executor named in the said Will being dead and no person applying for admⁿstrⁿ sh^d with the will annexed it is directed that the estate of the said Albert G. Harris de^d be committed to the hands of W W Briggs Sheriff of this County for administration according to law -

Ordered that W B Saunders, Elizabeth Adams, Jas G Peters, ^{Robert Dickson sworn three of them} being duly sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods or chattels of Albert G. Harris de^d and return that appraisement under their hands to the Clerk of the Court -

Ordered that F. T. Ridley, Henry L. Myrick, A. S. Potts & Benj. Turner or any three of them being first duly sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods or chattels of Thomas W. Biddle de^d and return the appraisement under their hands to the Clerk of this Court -

On the motion of James Holmes who made oath and together with Alfred J Stephenson & Adam White N. A. Wolf his Secretary (who justified as well as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the sum of four thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs to testify a granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Elizabeth Peden de^d in due form -

Ordered that W. W. Briggs, John Morris & James J. Justice being sworn for the purpose
