

On the motion of Mordcau Bradshaw, who made oath as together with John Britton & Jeremiah Chappell, his securities, (parties in each as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged bond in the penalty of four thousand Dollars conditioned according to law... *Ordained* is granted the said Mordcau Bradshaw for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Mordcau Bradshaw deceased in due form.

Ordered that Philip Ransom, R. M. Dolan, William Peck and Henry Edwards, or any three of them, may be duly sworn for the purpose to appraise, and to give an estimate of Mordcau Bradshaw deceased, their appraisement to be produced to them, and return the appraisement under their hands to the clerk of this Court.

Chris Moore, who was on the 3^d day of August 1868 designated Commissioner of the Revenue in District No. 1 in the County of Southampton pursuant to a writ of election issued by the Governor to fill the vacancy created in said office by a proclamation of the Governor for the unexpired term, but till the first day of February 1871 and until his successor is qualified, this day appeared in Court, and together with his Secy, D. Anthony Leo. Moore, his securities, (each justified as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged bond in the penalty of four thousand Dollars conditioned faithfully to discharge the duties of his said office according to law, which bond is ordered to be recorded and returned upon the said Chris Moore took the several oaths prescribed by law.

Wm. W. Cobb, who was on the 3^d day of August 1868 duly elected Attorney for the Commonwealth in this Court pursuant to a writ of election issued by the Governor to fill the vacancy created in said office by a proclamation of the Governor for the unexpired term, but till the first day of July 1868, and until his successor is qualified, this day appeared in Court and qualified by taking the oaths prescribed by law.

Ordered that all the acting Justices of this Court be summoned to the next term of this Court to prepare the instructions for the performance of their duties in Court and to take into consideration the establishment of a prison and the building, rebuilding and repairing of bridges in the County.
