thence more fully examined, reformed and ordered to be recorded.

The account of Samuel Kells late Sheriff of Marion Dist. Esq. Esq.
Executive proceedings of James M. Drury Esq. of Richard L. Bryant Esq. of Dury
or New Burgess Esq. of A. T. Stephenson Esq. and Samuel Diggs Esq. being
made and recorded in the Clerk's Office and there being no exception taken,
and ordered to be recorded.

Samuel Kells, who was on the 2^d day of August 1865 duly
elected Sheriff of this County pursuant to a proclamation of the
Governor of the 29th June 1865 to fill a vacancy caused by his
proclamation for the unexpired term, took, till the first day
of January 1867, and until his Successor is qualified. He
then appeared in Court and together with Samuel H. Kelly, Miller
Dr. Butler, Jordan D. Pottow, Col. A. L. Tracy, James H. Johnson
and Wm. H. Trotter, his securities, entered into and acknowledged
along in the presence of Thirty thousand Dollars conditioned
faithfully to discharge the Duties of his said office according
to law which bond is ordered to be recorded. Whereupon
the said Samuel Kells took the several oaths prescribed
by law.

On the motion of Samuel Kells Sheriff of this County Esq. and
Tracy is permitted to qualify as his Deputy and upon
his taking the several oaths prescribed by law. The said
being satisfied that he is a man of known probity and
good character.

Samuel D. Kells, who was on the 3^d day of August 1865 duly
elected Justice of the Peace in District No. 1 of this County pursuant to
a proclamation of the Governor of the 29th June 1865 and
July 2^d 1865, qualified by the Governor, this 1st day of October
prescribed by law.
