of January 1867, and until his Successor is qualified, he
has appeared in Court and together with Samuel H. Kells, John
D. Butler, Jordan D. Butler, Callahan L. Day, James H. Johnson
and Wm. M. Sutton, his securities, entered into and acknowledged
and in the penalty of thirty thousand Dollars conditioned
faithfully to discharge the duties of his said office according
to law. which bond is ordered to be recorded. And thereupon
the said Samuel Kells took the several oaths prescribed
by law.

On the motion of Samuel Kells Sheriff of the County of Bedford
 they is permitted to qualify as his Deputy and to appear
 he took the several oaths prescribed by Law. He has
 being satisfied that he is a man of honesty, probity and
 good demeanor.
