

The last will and testament of Jesse Fargusson dec'd was read, and proved by the oath of Richard L. Bryant one of the subscribers, witnesses thereto, and Richard D. L. Everett, the other subscriber, witnesses thereto being dead. Richard L. Bryant, being sworn deposes and swears that he is well acquainted with the last writing of Richard D. L. Everett and that the said Richard D. L. Everett was the same in his presence and at the same time that he was in the presence of the testator and that he truly believes that the said name is in the proper handwriting of the said Richard D. L. Everett and therefore the said will is admitted to record as the true last will and testament of the said Jesse Fargusson dec'd. And on the motion of the said Richard D. L. Bryant, his security, (who justifies himself as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of one thousand Dollars conditioned as aforesaid and a certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.

Ordered that Richard L. Bryant, Charles E. Bryant, & well bonded, and Orvant M. Bryant, or any three of them, being sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods or chattels of Jesse Fargusson dec'd that may be produced to them and make a return of the same.

On the motion of Collin A. Dicks who made oath and together with William Edwards, and Jesse Cobb, his securities, (who justify in oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of one thousand Dollars conditioned as aforesaid and a certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration of the estate of John Warner dec'd in due form.

Ordered that William Bradshaw, L. Cobb (or Geo. H. Bradshaw being sworn for the purpose) do appraise all the goods or chattels of John Warner dec'd that may be produced to him and make a return of the same.

Ordered that D. D. Miller is appointed Surveyor of the road from Pine Ridge to Hand Run or Branch in place of Abel. It is ordered that the usual laws be read and heard.

Ordered that James D. Mayhew, John Dutton and A. D. Taylor be appointed Commissioners in the part of this County to and leaving James of the Light's County and consider the propriety of establishing a road across Black River at the site of the old bridge and report to the Court their opinion on the probable costs of the same.
