Edwin A. Williams is appointed Overseer of the Road from the fork of the Road near D. B. Bates
to Dicksville in the case of Eliza Williams deceased and it is ordered that the usual bond work thereon

Ordered that Dr. J. J. Proctor, John J. Hinderick & R. J. Davidson examine the bridge across the
stream near at Jerusalem and the Embankment leading thence as well as any other bridge they may
think was eligible for a bridge and let to be done & undertaken the repairs of the old bridge & embankment
or the building of a new bridge & embankment as they may deem best and they are authorized to employ
and engage if in their opinion it is necessary and they are required to make report to Court

Ordered that the Sheriff do over all the acting Justices of this County to the next Court to appoint a
Special Police force under 11 Sections of Chapter 20th of the Code of Virginia and to consider the report
of Com-fessors appointed to let repairs of bridge & Embankment at or near Jerusalem
