

and W^m Prince, or any three of them being first duly sworn for the purpose, do appraise all the goods or chattels of Joseph Prince deceased that may be possessed by them and return the appraisement under their hands to the Clerk of this Court.

The last will and testament of William E. Gay deceased, was this day proved by the oath of William W. Lawrence one of the subscribing witnesses thereto and Lotteton Moore the other subscribing witness thereto being dead their oaths being taken as a witness in his presence at the same time and the presence of the testator at his request. Whereupon it is ordered that the said Will be read as the true last will and testament of the said William E. Gay deceased. And that the said Lotteton Moore be the only executor named in the said will being dead on the motion of Lotteton A. Gay who made oath to the said will and entered into a bond in the penalty of five thousand Dollars conditional according to Law, with Joseph E. Gay, Cecil S. Vaughan, W^m H. Daugherty, and Wm. Edwards his securities therein, (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency and which said bond, being acknowledged by the obligors therein is ordered to be recorded) Qualificate is granted to the said Lotteton A. Gay for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of the said William E. Gay deceased (which estate is declared to be of the value fifteen hundred Dollars) and his said will annexed in due form. A Stamp of the U. S. Internal Revenue to the amount of one Dollar being affixed hereto, as also one of the same amount on the bond aforesaid.

Ordered that A. W. Magle, Wm. Edwards W. W. Lawrence and Jas. Vaughan, or any three of them being first duly sworn, for the purpose, do appraise all the goods or chattels of W^m A. Gay dec^d that may be possessed by them and return the appraisement under their hands to the Clerk of this Court.

On motion of W^m Vaughan the Court doth adjudge, do and decree that Ermy Wells, Joseph Darden and Milling Vaughan who are hereby appointed special Commissioners for that purpose shall after reasonable notice to all the parties concerned proceed to allow to Matilda Vaughan widow of Matthew Vaughan Dec^d one third in value of the lands whereof Matthew Vaughan died seized and supposed to contain seven hundred acres, and report their proceedings to the Court in order to a further decree.
