



On the motion of John Pottler for administration on the estate of Mary Bonford who declares on solemn affirmation that the said estate decedent owned in the value the sum of \$700. The said John Pottler made solemn affirmation according to law and together with Charles Robinson, Alexander H. Bonadon & Zachariah Doyal his security who solemnly affirmed as to the sufficiency valued into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of \$1400. conditioned according to law - which bond having a stamp of the internal revenue of the United States of the amount of one dollar, is added to be recorded. Certificate is granted the said John Pottler for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of the said Mary Bonford decedent in due form - a stamp of the U. States internal revenue of the amount of one dollar being affixed thereto.

Ordered that Mr. Attorney John Campbell take Lewis Zachariah Doyal & Jeremiah Chappell or any three of them being duly sworn for the purpose to appraise all the goods & chattels of Mary Bonford decedent that may be produced or shown to them and return the appraisement under their hands to the Clerk of this Court.

On the motion of Samuel Hells who produced to the Court the Sheriff's report for the hereby granted him to keep an Ordinary in the Town of Jerusalem from 18 November 1865 to 31 May of April 1866 the Court being of opinion that the applicant is sober and of good character and will probably keep a house, orderly, useful and such as the law requires.

By consent the license the day granted Samuel Hells to keep an Ordinary in Jerusalem is hereby transferred to Henry J. Harris according to law.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the acting Justices of this County to the first day of next Term next to consider the propriety of granting to the merchants in this County licenses to retail wine and spirituous or a mixture thereof at their respective stores, and to take into consideration the propriety of rebuilding the bridge across the Black Water river.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term.
