Gloude for the year 1866, whether of principal or interest of their estate and also report what amount each of the debtors is to pay to the said guardian, how much principal is to be paid of any and report to the Court with any other deemed pertinent to be reported by him or any other special matter which may be required to be stated by any of the parties interested —

The Court, with the consent of the mother, doth order that one of the Overseers of the Poor of this County do bind William Hause Parks infant child of Nancy Parks, colored woman, to Jane W. Proctor according to law, until he attains the age of twenty one years (he was born the 29th of May 1864) and in the event of the death of Mrs. Proctor before the said William Henry's term of service he is to serve out his term with J. D. Proctor and the Court further orders that for the services of said W. Henry the said Jane W. Proctor pay to Nancy Parks his mother the sum of one hundred dollars

The Court, with the consent of the mother, doth order that one of the Overseers of the Poor of this County do bind William Henry, in fact son of Nancy Barrett, to Jane W. Proctor according to law, until he attains the age of twenty one years (he was born the 30th of May 1864) and in the event of the death of Mrs. Proctor before the expiration of the said William Henry's term of service he is to serve out his term with J. D. Proctor and the Court further orders that for the services of said W. Henry the said Jane W. Proctor pay to Nancy Barrett mother of the said W. Henry One hundred dollars for the services of said William Henry —

The Court, with the consent of the mother, doth order that one of the Overseers of the Poor of this County do bind Julia Chappell woman of color, until she attains the age of eighteen years (she was born the 2nd of June 1865) to Jane W. Proctor for the services of the said Adeline Proctor to pay to Julia Chappell her mother twenty five dollars —

The Court doth order that one of the Overseers of the Poor of this County pay Robert Thomas Hill a boy of color to Jane W. Proctor according to law until he attains the age of twenty one years the said Robert Thomas having heretofore been bound to Robert J. Proctor & the Indenture transferred to said Jane W. Proctor

The Court doth order that further the consent of the mother, one of the Overseers of the Poor of this County do bind Jerry Bell infant of Amanda Bell, woman of color, of the age of eight years this month in the 8th December 1865, apprentices to Jane W. Proctor according to law until he arrives to the of 21 years. And in the event of the death of Mrs. Proctor before the attainment of eighteen years, the balance of the term is to be served out under J. D. Proctor. And the mother Amanda is to receive for the services of said Jerry one hundred dollars as a general
