

At a quarterly Term of the County Court of Southampton County, continued and held
for said County on Tuesday the 28th day of August 1866.

Ordered that Ferdinand E. Johnson, Leal C. Vaughan, & James R. Gardner be appointed Commissioners to act in conjunction with Commissioners appointed by the Commonwealth
County to collect the taxes assessed, either privately or publicly, as they may deem best, the
leasing of a ferry across Black Water River, at New South Quay, for the term of one or more
years, not exceeding three, and that they make report to Court.

William J. Bailey is appointed Surveyor of the Roads beginning at Benjamin Building
and ending at Seacock bridge near John Crumpler's room of Henry Banks and the
usual roads unto thence.

On motion of Jas. H. Smith on his of Moody Smalls it is ordered that Jacob
Brook (of Humpburg) William Edwards & Harry Edwards, any three of whom
may act, are appointed Commissioners to inquire into the Nancy Smalls in her
estate when of her late husband Moody Smalls died during his life & to make report to Court.

On motion of Jackson (joint) guardian of Edith, Hal & Ellis Branch it is
ordered that George Wren be summoned to appear here on the first day of the next term
to show cause why he was not made at July Court last directing the said Edith
Hal & Ellis to be bound to him should not be remitted?

The Report of Commissioner Howard, made on behalf of Jas. H. Smith of County of
H. I. Booth do, affixing certain amounts to be paid him by debtors to him as such debts
to be applied to paying for the boards, clothes & other necessary expenses of the minor children
of said Jas. H. Smith as provided for by the act of the General Assembly of Va. passed the 2^d
day of March 1864, added "an act laying the collection of debts for a limited period
having been filed in the Clerk's Office of this Court for one month & no exception being
filed thereto, the said report is approved & confirmed by the Court, and it is ordered
that the said report be made record by the Clerk of this Court for such further pro-
ceedings theron as may be proper. And it is ordered that the rate be apportioned
among the debtors equally."

JAMES ATKINS a colored person, who stands committed to the jail of this County charged with
a felony committed in this, that he did in the day time, on the 17th of July 1866
in the said County, break and enter the store house of Joseph R. Morse with intent there
and there to commit larceny, was this day set to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of the
County (Edward Beale one of the members of the Court was the Commissioner of Justice during
this trial with the court of the prisoners) and the Court having heard all witness and
opinion that the said James Atkins ought to be tried for the said offense which he stands
charged before the Court of this County. The said James Atkins made the Court to
be allowed to enter into a recognizance with security for his appearance before the Court to
be tried, which audience the Court did award, and allowed the same Atkins to enter into
such recognizance himself in the sum of \$200. with sufficient security in like sum.
