Ordered that the Sheriff collect from each male person over the age of 16 years one dollar of 1866 and levy on land and other property assessed with State Taxes within this County and on the interest of property undivided in the 49<sup>th</sup> of the yearly income in the 57<sup>th</sup> and the fees in the 57<sup>th</sup> Sections of the 35<sup>th</sup> Chapter of the Code of Virginia on which Taxes are assessed against persons residing in this County on hundred of 1866 pursuant therewith pay and discharge the foregoing allowances made on this day of those made on previous days, and the balance if any retained in his hands subject to the future orders of this Court.

W<sup>m</sup> E. Keale is appointed Surveyor of the road from the forks of the road near Big Spring bridge to Joppa's Store in the town of North St. Bishop's parish, and it is ordered that the several boards do work the road.

Ordered that W<sup>m</sup> E. Keale, Stark St. Bishop and Augustus Campbell be appointed Commissioners to bid out to the lowest bidder the keeping of the Ferry at Monroe for the next three years at so much per annum & report to Court for confirmation.

Ordered that two of the Overseers of the poor of this County bid out as an apprentice to Richard Leonard Hamlet, Albert Hamlet a person of color formerly a slave of the said R. C. Hamlet and of the age of sixteen years on the first day of this instant. The said R. C. Hamlet to teach or cause to be taught to the said Albert, the art, trade and mystery of a farmer. One to read & write, &c.

That the said R. C. Hamlet pay to the said apprentice the following sums respectively for each years service of the said apprentice - five dollars per year beginning from the first day of this instant - that is five dollars on the first day of August 1867 and five dollars on each succeeding first day of August thereafter for four years making \$20. and ten dollars per year for each succeeding five years thereafter making \$50. and thirty dollars for the last year of the service of the said apprentice, making in all \$100.00 &c.
