The last will and Testament of Martha M. Griffin dec'd was this day proved by the solemn affirmation of Jeremiah Doyel, Joseph J. Harris & John Sumner, the subscribing witnesses thereto and allowed to be recorded. And on the motion of Jeremiah Doyel, the executor therein named who made solemn affirmation and together with John Doyel and John Sumner, his co-executors, (who justified in solemn form as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of one hundred & fifty Dollars conditioned as the law directs, which bond having stamps of the internal revenue of the United States of the amount of one dollar is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted the said Jeremiah Doyel for obtaining a probate of said Will in the first Stamp of the internal revenue of the United States of the amount of one dollar being affixed thereto.

Ordered that Jeremiah Chappell, Josephus Sumner and John Sumner, being sworn for the purpose, do appraise all the goods and chattels of Martha M. Griffin dec'd. that may be produced to them, and return the appraisement under their hands to the Clerk of this Court.
