It appearing that the Defendants have had legal notice of this motion they were solemnly called and not appearing Whereupon on the motion of the plaintiff it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff may have execution against the Defendants for the sum of three hundred dollars being the amount of fees & against them for her maintenance by Commissioners. This under the provisions of an act of the General Assembly of Virginia entitled "An act to stay the collection of debts for a limited period passed March 2. 1866. and her costs by her in this behalf expended.

The Commissioners appointed at the August Term of this Court to examine a bridge lately built across Black Bank by Zachary Dege and George. Harman & report to Court whether the said bridge was built in a good and workmanlike manner. They made their report stating the said bridge was built in a good and workmanlike manner which report being considered by the Court is adopted and ordered to be filed.

On the motion of George H. Darden who made oath and together with Benjamin J. Bryant, Richard L. Bryant, and Charles C. Bryant his Sureties, (who justified in each as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged bond in the penalty of Two thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, which having a stamp of the internal revenue of the United States of the amount of one dollar affixed thereto is ordered to be recorded, but before being granted him for obtaining letters of administration in the estate of Samuel A. Darden dec'd. in due form. A stamp of the internal revenue of the United States of the amount of one dollar being affixed hereto.

Ordered that Davis Hurst, Jas. J. Darden, Geo. H. Ward and Benjamin J. Bryant or any three of them being sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods in chattels of Samuel A. Darden dec'd. that may be produced to them and return the appraisement under their hands to the Clerk of this Court.

On the motion of Samuel Vick who made oath and together with Thomas B. Dwyer & Edwin R. Jones his Sureties (who justified in each as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged bond in the penalty of Two hundred Dollars conditioned as the law directs, which bond having a stamp of the internal revenue of the United States of the amount of one dollar
