

John H. Bogard who has been recognized to appear here this day appeared in Court in discharge of his recognizance and was discharged as recognizance being returned.

Wm H. Coggesdale who was recognized to appear here on this day before a Justice of the peace of this County, this day appeared in discharge of his recognizance and on his motion was allowed to enter into recognizance himself in the sum of \$100.00 with sufficient security in the like sum for his appearance before the Circuit Court of this County at the next term to answer an indictment to be preferred against him by the Grand Jury for a larceny in stealing one herring of the value of the property of Richmond Edwards. And thereupon the said Wm H. Coggesdale entered into a recognizance in the sum of \$100.00 with Richd H. Gardner his security, in the like sum of \$100.00 conditioned for the appearance of the said Wm H. Coggesdale before the Judge of the Circuit Court of this County on the first day of the next term to answer any indictment of the Grand Jury to be preferred against him at that term.

The Commissioners appointed to bid to the lowest bidder for the repairs or rebuilding of the bridge across Clearcut Swamp at John Crompkins and receive the same when completed, this day made their report which is ordered to be filed, and it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County out of any contingent money moneys in his hands and not otherwise appropriated pay to Charles S. Biddle the sum of forty four dollars for rebuilding said bridge.

The Court doth appoint Kenneth M. Hogebart curator of the estate of Caroline M. Boykin dec'd. during the absence of her will. Whereupon he together with James W. Hogebart, his security, (who justified on oath as to his sufficient estate) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of fifteen hundred dollars conditioned according to law, which bond having a stamp of the internal revenue of the amount of one dollar affixed thereto is ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that John J. Holmes, James B. Hogebart, John P. Boykin, James G. Jones and John Rivers or any three of them being sworn for the purpose to appraise all the goods or chattels of Caroline M. Boykin dec'd. that may be produced to them and return the appraisement under their hands to the Clerk of the Court.
