

The two infants Mary E. Coland and John S. Coland for the year 1866, and his costs by him in this behalf expended.

Ordered that Richard J. Darden, Thomas J. Driscoll, Thomas Vaughan & Benjamin E. Howell (any three of whom may act) be appointed commissioners and by virtue of Chapter 52 Act of 1860 to view and report to the Court upon the proper location for a road to lead from the Abutment or termination end of the bridge across Hottelows river at Jerusalem to the old or former road that they report all inconveniences and incumbrances that will result as well to individuals as to the public generally, and especially whether any yard, garden, crop or any part thereof will have to be taken. And any other matters that they may deem pertinent and report to Court.

Ordered that an Ordsen of the poor of this County bind as apprentice to David H. Knicker, now Knicker about seven or eight years old, Hester Knicker nine years old & Mary Knicker five years old till they arrive, the said Ben J. Heggelick to twenty one years and the said Hester to fifteen years. That the said David H. Knicker pay to the said Ben five dollars per year till he is fifteen years old & thirteen dollars per year thereafter making \$95 to the said Hester \$8 per year for the last five years of his apprenticeship, making \$40. and to the said Heggelick \$5 per year for the last five years of his apprenticeship making \$30. The said apprentices having been former slaves of Henry W. Knicker, and being likely to become chargeable to the County and they to be taught to read & write.

Ordered that an Ordsen of the Poor of this County bind as an apprentice to John J. Knicker & William Drury 11 years old Aaron Drury 8 1/2 years old and James Drury 7 1/2 years old persons of color till they arrive respectively to the ages of 21 years that the said Knicker pay to the said William \$5 per year for the first five years and ten dollars per year for the last five years. to Aaron and James Drury five dollars per year from their thirteenth years to their fifteenth years and ten dollars per year thereafter to each. the said apprentices former slaves of Samuel Drury and being likely to become chargeable to this County. They are to be taught to read & write.

It having been represented to the Court that the Monroe ferry franchise is to be sold as next Court, the Court doth appoint Jos. H. Campbell, Benjamin Bryant & Levi Wells to ascertain and report to Court whether in their judgment it would be advisable for the County to purchase the same for the use of the public.
