

Proceedings of the Court of Common Pleas  
in the County of Southampton.

On the Day of the same filed.

Present Geo. C. Rose & Alfred S. Stephenson Justl.

Parker Gray, a free person of colour, who stands charged with a felony by him committed in this, that he did on the 18<sup>th</sup> Day of October 1866, in the County of Southampton, bear or have the value of Thirty dollars of the goods and chattels of Wilson & Magella on board in the steamship which he feloniously did Steal, take and carry away was this Day set to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of this County, and the Court having heard the evidence of opinion that the aforesaid is guilty of a misdemeanor for which he ought to be in the County Gaol, the March Term of this County next. Thereupon the said Justice giving words the Court to be allowed to enter into recognizance with security for his appearance before the said County Court, which motion the Court entertained and allowed the said Parker Gray to enter into such recognizance himself with sum of fifty dollars with sufficient Security in a letter sum. And the said Parker Gray is remanded to jail until he enter into such recognizance.

On the instant of Anna E.
