George L. Spivey a Justice of the Peace in the 5 Magistrate's District in this County on
 day this day, tendered his resignation of his Office which the Court accepts -

 white girl aged about thirteen years which motion was opposed by Oliver White by Counsel
 the Court after hearing the parties and the witnesses introduced is of opinion & therefore order
 that on Counsel of this County do bind the said Lucinda Wells as an apprentice to the said Dr. J. R. R.
 M. Stephens till she arrives to the age of 18 years. Also that besides an out among the apprentice
 and teaching her reading & writing and common arithmetic including the rule of three the master
 will pay her ten dollars a year every year during her apprenticeship.

 apprenticeship.
