Ordered that an Overseer of the poor of this County bind James Drury colored boy, aged eight years to John Kindred according to law to learn the art, trade or mystery of a Farmer, and besides maintaining the apprentices and teaching him reading, writing, & common arithmetic including the rule of three, the said Kindred is to pay the said James five dollars per year from his thirteenth year to his fifteenth year, and ten dollars per year thereafter during the apprenticeship - the said James a former slave of Samuel Drury and being likely to become chargeable to the County -

Ordered that an Overseer of the poor of this County bind Abram Drury colored boy aged nine years to John Kindred according to law to learn the art, trade or mystery of a Farmer, and besides maintaining the apprentice and teaching him reading, writing, and common arithmetic including the rule of three, the said Kindred is to pay the said Abram now five dollars per year from his thirteenth year to his fifteenth year and ten dollars per year thereafter during the apprenticeship - the said Abram a former slave of Samuel Drury and being likely to become chargeable to the County -

Ordered that an Overseer of the poor of this County bind Abram Drury colored boy aged nine years to John Kindred according to law to learn the art, trade or mystery of a Farmer, and besides maintaining the apprentice and teaching him reading, writing, and common arithmetic including the rule of three, the said Kindred is to pay the said Abram now five dollars per year from his thirteenth year to his fifteenth year and ten dollars per year thereafter during the apprenticeship - the said Abram a former slave of Samuel Drury and being likely to become chargeable to the County -
