Battle & Joseph Gardner who being sworn the Court read the indictment and the jury joined upon their verdict returned a verdict in their words: "We the jury find the prisoner guilty." Therefore it is considered by the Court that the said Arthur Williams be confined in the jail of this County for the term of one month and thereupon the said Arthur Williams is remanded to jail.

Hays in this County in the night time with intent to commit larceny was this day set to the bar in custody of the jailer of this Court, and this Court having heard the evidence as of opinion that the said Allen Banks ought to be tried for the offense of which he stands charged before the Circuit Court of this County and thereupon he is remanded to jail.

Winifred Moore a colored person who stands indicted of larceny was set to the bar in custody of the jailer of this Court and pleaded not guilty to the Indictment. Whereupon came a jury to wit John Moore, Levi W. Stephenson, W. W. Branch, W. H. Atkinson, Ed. S. Davis, R. B. Blythe, Collier Ricks, W. W. Briggs, Joseph Gardner, A. H. Stephenson, Eli Spring & R. J. Dandor who being sworn the Court read the indictment and the jury joined upon their verdict returned a verdict in their words as say: "We the jury find the Defendant not guilty." Therefore it is considered by the Court that the Defendant be acquitted and discharged of the offense aforesaid and that he be discharged from custody.

George Davis a person of color who stands indicted of larceny was set to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of this County and pleaded not guilty to the Indictment. Whereupon came a jury to wit John Moore, Levi W. Stephenson, W. W. Branch, W. H. Atkinson, Ed. S. Davis, R. B. Blythe, Collier Ricks, W. W. Briggs, Joseph Gardner, A. H. Stephenson, Eli Spring & R. J. Dandor who being sworn the Court read the indictment and the jury joined upon their verdict returned a verdict in the following words to wit: "We the jury find the Defendant not guilty." Therefore it is considered by the Court that the Defendant be acquitted and discharged of the offense aforesaid, and that he be discharged from custody.
