Harris \$157.53 to the exec. W. Harris \$157.53 all interest, that he pay to Mr. Rogers for L. G. Harris \$36.67 the exec. W. Harris \$36.63 of which \$47.09 is interest & \$36.26 is principal that \$3.67 the exec. W. Harris pay L. G. Harris \$3.77 to exec. W. Harris \$3.73 of which sum \$17.46
